Umpiring Development Program

Every year the Umpiring committee & many dedicated mentors help to develop those players who would like to Umpire. As you are all aware we cannot have teams take the court without 2 umpires at each game. BHSNA have an 'umpire your own' approach which means with 20 teams this year, we need to field 20 umpires every single week. At ODNC we do pay our umpires on a sliding scale based on experience / badge level.

Regardless of whether a club pays their umpires or not, Umpiring is still very much a volunteer service – a fact frequently overlooked or taken for granted by players and spectators, who readily criticise the umpire for decisions and rarely offer praise. The importance of umpiring upon the maintenance of a good standard of play can never be stressed too strongly. However outstanding the players, however effective the coaching, in the long run it is the efficiency of the umpiring which influences the standard of play. Even lower standard teams with little or no coaching can improve with consistently good umpiring. An umpire is an integral part of the game and can make or mar a game.

We are currently taking names for those players who wish to participate in our 2018 development program. Timeframes to commence, days and dates will largely depend on how many players wish to participate and availability of the majority.

Red Award Program - This is run by individual clubs and is typically made up of either a x6 week 1hr theory and practical session OR a 5 hour continuous session on a weekend.

ALL participates are encouraged to complete the online level 1 theory exam (which is free), holding a 70% pass or higher prior to the commencement of our development program.

Umpire Code of Behaviour

In addition to Netball Australia's General Code of Behaviour, umpires must meet the following requirements with regard to their conduct during any activity held by or under the auspices of Netball Australia, Member Organisations or Affiliates in their role as an umpire.

- Umpire in accordance with the Official Rules of the Game.
- Treat all players, coaches, bench officials and other umpires with respect.
- Place the safety and welfare of the players above all else, including by:
- Ensuring the court and its surrounds are compliant with the rules.
- Taking appropriate action to manage dangerous play.
- Maintain a high standard of personal behaviour at all times.
- Be a positive role model through behaviour and personal appearance projecting a favourable image of netball and umpiring at all times.
- Refrain from conduct which could be regarded as sexual harassment, discrimination, bullying or victimisation.
- Be courteous, respectful and open to discussion and interaction with other netball participants.
- Maintain or improve your current performance level and seek continual improvement.
- Be honest and do not allow your qualifications/accreditation to be misrepresented.
